Remote Learning in Chinook's Edge School Division

Our Off-Campus Learning Centre and Career High Schools are proud to offer Remote Learning to students who are not returning to their traditional school settings this fall. Our approach to Remote Learning will continue to ensure the support and care of all our students until they are ready to return to in-class learning in their traditional school. We realize for some students that may be a matter of weeks, while for others it may be this full year. In either situation, we want to provide a learning experience that sets all of our Chinook's Edge students up for success.

Remote Learning Quick Facts

What is Remote Learning? Remote Learning takes place at home and students will be assigned to a Chinook's Edge School Off-Campus Learning Centre or Career High School teacher who is not part of the traditional school, but is experienced in meeting the needs of remote learning and alternative programming.

K-9 offered through Off-Campus: In Grades K-9 through our Off-Campus Learning Centre, English Language Arts, Math, Science, Social Studies and Physical Education will be offered.

Grades 10-12 offered at Career Highs: In Grade 10-12, English Language Arts, Social Studies, Math, Sciences, CALM and Physical Education. (Other option courses required for graduation will be offered later in the semester or year)

Hours of Work: The average hours of work per student per week will be similar to those students receiving face-to-face instruction. This will vary between 4 - 6 hours per day depending on the grade level or courses taken.

Student Assessment: All remote students will receive assessments and grades as if they were in a regular classroom.

Google Meet: For students with internet access, an assigned Off-Campus or Career High teacher will be connecting with students 1 or 2 times per week via Google Meet depending on the grade level.

Google Classroom: Teachers will be delivering content and instruction via Google Classroom or other appropriate learning management systems. Instruction will occur asynchronously (students working on their own) and synchronously (students working in real-time with their Off-Campus or Career High teacher) depending on the grade level of the student.

Specialized Support for Students Without Internet: Paper-based materials can be sanitized and provided to those families without internet access.

Parent Support: Parent support will be required to ensure that student learning is moving forward.

Specialized Supports for Students - A student on an IPP would continue to have an IPP. This would be developed by the Off Campus or Career High teacher.

Transitioning Back Into The School: During September, students will be allowed to transition back to in-person learning in consultation with the principal. After October 1st, parents will make a request to the school principal and a re-entry plan will be determined (by the principal in consultation with the Superintendency Team within 10 days of the request) based on factors such as grade level, semestered courses, reporting periods, class sizes, and natural breaks in the school calendar.

Pre-Kindergarten will not be offered through remote learning.
