Election of Board Executive:

The Chinook's Edge Board of Education held their annual Organizational Meeting on September 11th, which involves the election of the Board's executive positions. The Board elected Allan Tarnoczi as Chair, Colleen Butler as Vice Chair, and Holly Bilton as Second Vice Chair. Colleen Butler, who has held the Chair position for the past nine years, had provided the Board with advanced notice that she would not be running for the position this school year as part of her personal succession plan.



"I believe that unity is our defining strength as a Board, and I believe this serves our division and

our students well," said Chair Tarnoczi. "I am looking forward to continuing our governance journey together as Board Chair, and I would like to thank Colleen Butler for her many years of strong leadership on our Board."

Student Enrolment numbers:

Student numbers as of today's date were discussed, although these numbers may fluctuate somewhat prior to the final report being filed with the provincial government on September 30. The report shows enrolment is up slightly in Chinook's Edge.

Board Committees:

Trustees committed to the Board of Education's standing and ad hoc committees, as part of the Organizational Committee Meeting. A full list will be available on the Board section of the Division website. As a new approach, the work of the Finance Committee will now be dealt with by the Board as a whole.

Summer School Report:

The Board reviewed a report from the three Chinook's Edge communities where Summer School had been held this year: Sylvan Lake had 59 registered students, Innisfail had 54 students (who wrote 20 Diploma Exams) and Olds had 42 students. Summer School provides high school students with the opportunity to take courses to upgrade existing marks, complete a required course missing from their timetable, or for personal reasons.
