Transportation Update:

The Board reviewed a quarterly Transportation report, including ride times and fleet renewal requirements for the upcoming year. This represents approximately \$700,000 in fleet renewal costs to the Transportation budget, which includes a special handicapped-equipped bus that is required to replace an aging bus.

Preparation for relocatable classrooms:

The Board approved the use of funds from land sales to construct a connecting hallway for four relocatable classrooms that were recently announced for Jessie Duncan Elementary School. Rapid growth in the Town of Penhold has resulted in capacity and utilization challenges at all three Chinook's Edge schools, and the addition of these classrooms at Jessie Duncan will ease the pressure at each school. As a result, the following grade configurations will be in effect at the beginning of the 2018-2019 school year:

Jessie Duncan School: Pre-Kindergarten - Grade 3

Penhold Elementary School: Grades 4-6

Penhold Crossing Secondary School: Grades 7-12

Capital Plan 2019-2022:

The Board approved an updated Capital Plan, which represents the highest capital priorities in the division. An extensive study was undertaken by the Facilities Committee, to ensure objective guidelines are used to determine the updated report. The report will be filed with the Alberta Government as follows: 1) expansion of Carstairs Elementary School to meet demographics and community growth; 2) new Olds Elementary School to meet demographics and community growth; 3) H.J Cody High School modernization in Sylvan Lake, which remains the division's highest modernization priority; 4) replacement of current Penhold Elementary School with a new 600 capacity middle school; 5) request for a new 500 capacity Pre-Kindergarten to Grade 4 school in Carstairs.

Naloxone Kits:

The Board requested the Superintendent to further assess the risk, required training, current trends and practices in other school divisions regarding the implementation of Naloxone Kits in schools, as a response to potential fentanyl exposure.

Indigenous Education:

The Board discussed the learning opportunities that were shared by Indigenous Education expert, Charlene Bearhead, during a recent PD session for Chinook's Edge school leaders. Ms. Bearhead shared stories and discussions, and led the group through plans for next steps.

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Recognition of Excellence:

The Board congratulated several students who earned 100% on Diploma Exams, and acknowledged the hard work of their teachers.
