Capital Plan 2018-2021:

The Chinook's Edge Board of Education approved the list of priority projects, which includes: Carstairs Elementary School addition and gym expansion, Jessie Duncan School (Penhold) addition, École H.J. Cody School (Sylvan Lake) modernization, École Olds Elementary School modernization, Penhold new elementary school, and Carstairs new elementary school. Transportation Quarterly Update:

The Board reviewed bus route timelines which, in some communities, are approaching the maximum desired ride times. This is a challenge being faced in school divisions across the province, where funding shortfalls are requiring that each bus be filled for maximum efficiency which is adding to ride times in certain cases. Trustees will continue their lobbying efforts to ensure adequate provincial funding to support the distance challenges in a large rural school division.

Real Property Surplus:


In accordance with policy requiring an annual report, the Board received information on the following surplus lands: former River Glen property in Red Deer, West Hope property east of Carstairs (which has been leased out until 2020).

Naloxone Kits:

The Board directed the Superintendent to pursue the implementation of Naloxone Kits in schools. In keeping with the division's top priority of safety, Naloxone Kits are a response to fentanyl overdose which is a growing concern in society at large. A detailed strategy is being put in place, in conjunction with the division's insurance specialists, regarding staff training and education in best practices.

Animals in Schools:

The Board approved Administrative Procedure 2-23, which outlines guidelines and expectations around animals in schools (excluding service dogs). The inclusion of animals is recognized as an opportunity for significant, motivational experiences that enhance learning, however the inclusion must take into consideration the health and safety of students, staff and animals.
