For these children, this program is life-changing," said Miss Lucy.

"The research around language, in particular, shows strongly that reaching children while they are very young is the basis for success in future learning," said École Steffie Woima Elementary Vice Principal, Dawn Normoyle, whose Special Education background makes her a passionate advocate for Pre-Kindergarten.

"Pre-Kindergarten provides support and intervention to meet individual needs, but it is also a nice way for children to understand the structure and expectations of school. I can see such a difference in these kids by the end of Pre-K, because I track their achievements as we go along to ensure we're seeing growth. Our goal is for these kids to feel secure and safe and cared for in a play-based language-rich environment, so they know that school is a place where their needs are met. Once the family is part of the school, they are part of a team that can help them access other supports and resources. It becomes a community of support around each little person."
