Inclement Weather in Alberta

It's a certainty that we will experience inclement weather in the coming months, but unfortunately it isn't always predictable and the weather varies a great deal across our school division.

Our first priority is always safety. We want to be mindful that it is far better to stay safe and sacrifice one day of school in exchange for a lifetime of learning. We are very clear to our staff that we do not want them traveling when they determine it is unsafe to do so. We want to be equally as clear to you as parents, that we do not want our high school students who drive, or you as parents, to be driving to our schools when it is unsafe to do so.

In extreme weather conditions, we may close one or more schools and ask that no one in that particular community travel. These days are called red days.

Days when our schools are open but our buses aren't running, are referred to as yellow days. We need our staff, our students that drive, and our parents not to travel if they feel it is unsafe. It is also important that you inform your school if your child will not be in attendance on yellow days - we cannot make any assumptions when safety is at stake. Because we do not always have accurate weather information for every corner of our division at our fingertips, we rely on individuals to make good decisions for themselves knowing the weather conditions in their area.

On both yellow and red days we do our best to allow access to learning and to move learning forward regardless of a weather disruption.
