Skills competition

Eriksson said, "This was such a great learning experience, and I hope to be back next year!"

Scott Etienne, Career and Technology Studies (CTS) teacher, Didsbury High School, said, "Johan is only in Grade 10 and this well earned provincial silver medal will give him impetus to pursue his goals in school and for the rest of his life."

Lorenz said, "It was a lot of fun. I liked the experience and I want to try welding next year." Lorenz said the Skills Canada experience has helped him know that a career in the trades is a good choice for his future.

The students went to observe students from around the province competing in dozens of different categories of trades, and participating in specific events such as "Girls Exploring Trades and Technologies".



"We were thrilled to send so many students to Edmonton this year to compete or experience the skilled trades and technology event," said Jackie Taylor, Executive Director of the Community Learning Campus. "The more students gain exposure to a variety of career pathways, the more successful they will be in their career selection and transition following high school graduation.

"Also, we see students find greater meaning in high school programming and have higher levels of achievement when they begin to make their career connections ahead of Grade 12.Our CESD goal is to provide many career experience opportunities to students across their K to 12 education that will best prepare them for successful transitions to the world of career training," said Taylor.
