Introduction to the Fire Rescue Services Course Sequence

Subject: Career and Technology Studies - Discipline: Career Transitions

Firefighting is a challenging and rewarding career that provides individuals with the opportunity to provide important services to their communities. In Fire Rescue Services 15, students investigate the equipment, practices and specialized skills used in fire rescue services. Throughout this course, students explore the dynamics of teamwork and collaboration. Students in Fire Rescue Services 15 are encouraged to take risks in exploring how to learn through experience, communicate effectively and collaborate with others to achieve success. Fire Rescue Services 15 is intended to enhance students' skill sets and support their long-term goals and career aspirations.

Student Need

Fire Rescue Services 15 provides students with an opportunity to learn about and experience the role of a firefighter. Throughout this course, students have opportunities to develop a variety of competencies. In particular, the examination of fire-related variables and fire rescue equipment and techniques fosters communication, critical thinking and problem solving. As well, engaging in fitness training and fire rescue simulation activities supports students' personal growth and well-being. Fire Rescue Services 15 provides students with the opportunity to investigate potential careers related to fire rescue services.
